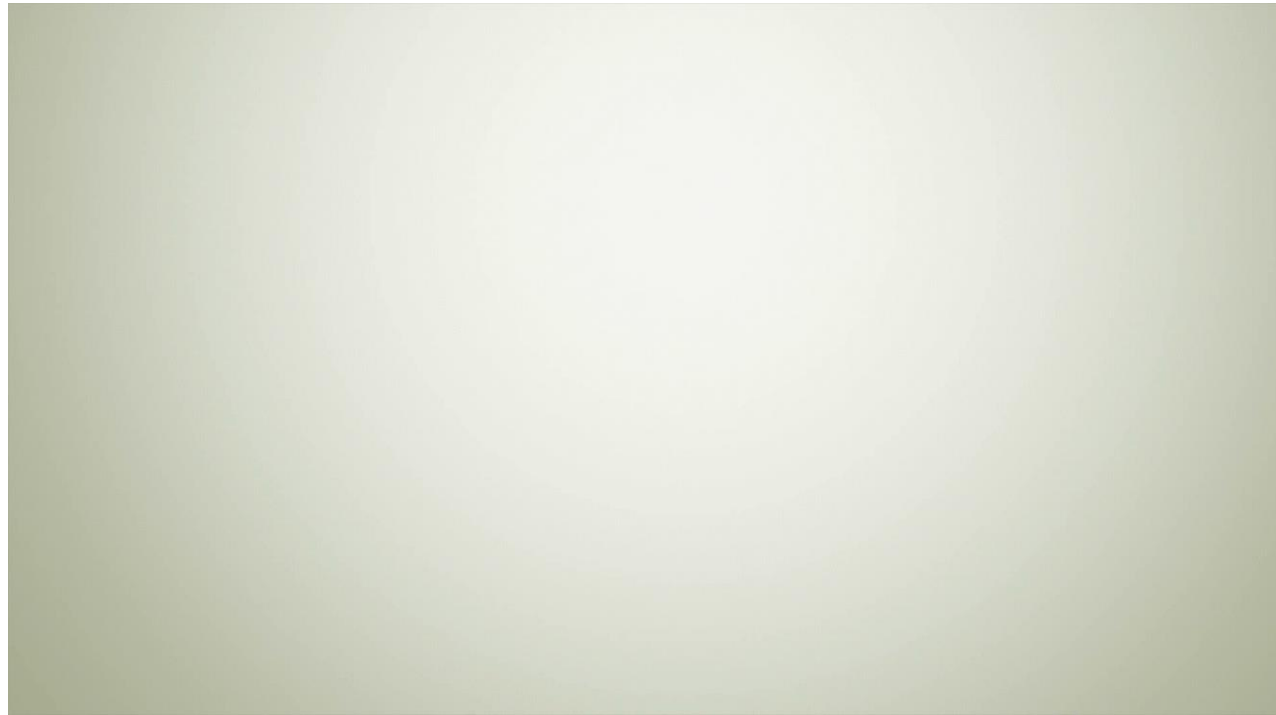

# 4 + 1 Assessment Pathway Requirements for Regents Diploma

- ▶ Students may take four Regents exams (ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies) and a comparably rigorous assessment for the fifth required examination to graduate.
- ▶ The fifth assessment required for graduation may include any one of the following assessments:
  - ▶ One additional social studies Regents examination
  - ▶ One additional Regents examination in a different course in mathematics or science
  - ▶ A career and technical education (CTE) pathway assessment (CITI)

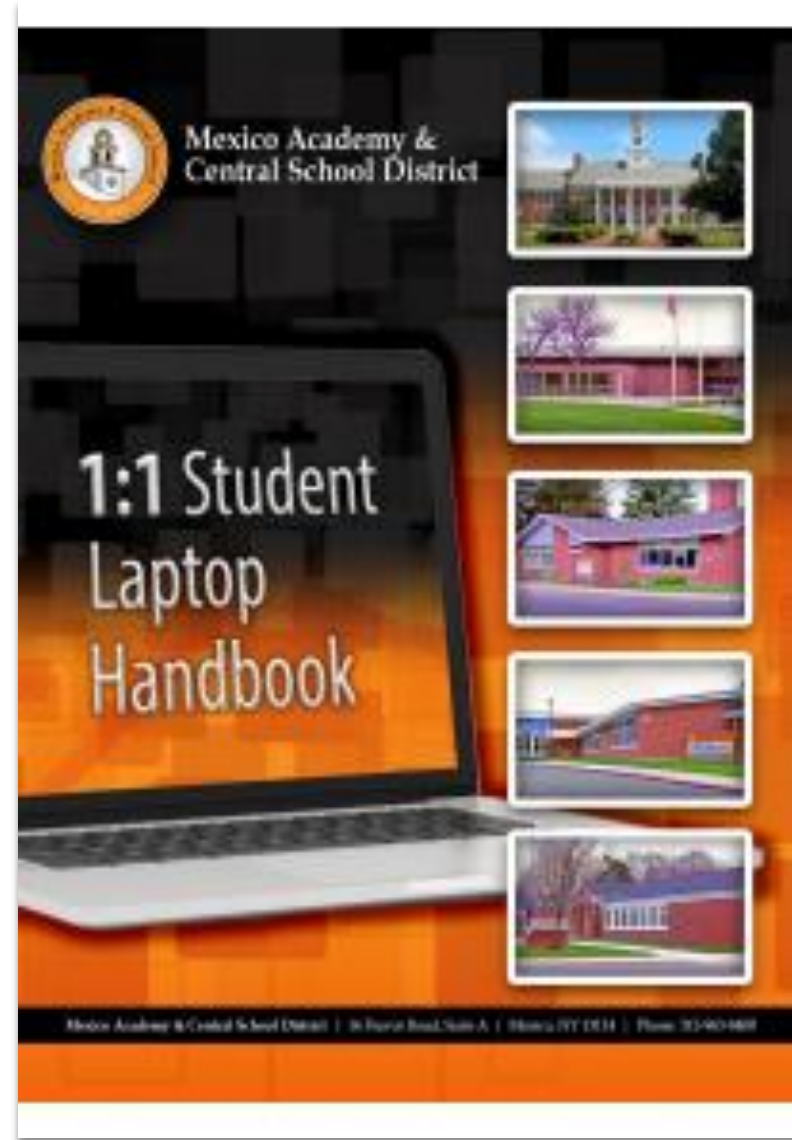
# Additional expectations for laptop care:

- ▶ Laptops should never be removed from their protective cases by a student
- ▶ Carrying laptops by the screen or carrying laptops with the screen open can result in damage to the laptop
- ▶ Clean the screen with a clean, soft, lint free cloth. Slightly dampen the cloth with water when needed.
- ▶ Always close the laptop screen when storing the laptop
- ▶ NEVER share or allow others to use your username or password

# Keeping your laptop up and running:

- ▶ Shut down your computer before going to bed and close the screen
- ▶ Plug your computer in every night, so it is charged and ready for school
- ▶ Bring your laptop and power adapter to school EVERY day
- ▶ NEVER toss or throw your computer...screens are sensitive and expensive to replace (\$260)



## Borrowing a Laptop/Lost/Stolen Laptops

▶ ***All student laptops and chargers include the name and ID number of the student assigned to the device- Students may not alter, remove, or deface any aspect of the computer***

- If your laptop is damaged or in need of repair, bring your laptop to the library for a loaner
- If a student forgets their laptop for 2 consecutive days, a call will be made to the parent
- If a student forgets their laptop 5 times in a semester, a loaner will not be provided and the Assistant Principal's office will be notified

**If a student intentionally damages or permanently loses a laptop, the cost for replacement is as follows:**

- ▶ **Laptop:** \$400.00
- ▶ **Mouse** \$15
- ▶ **Case** \$28.35
- ▶ **Charger** \$48

# Acceptable Use Policy

- ▶ Access should be primarily for educational activities
- ▶ Users shall not attempt to bypass or disable security systems or established district restrictions

## Inappropriate Conduct

### **The following are prohibited:**

- ▶ Obscene, sexually explicit, vulgar, threatening, or disrespectful language
- ▶ Personal or generalized harassment
- ▶ Defamatory or false information
- ▶ Harassment, threats, or bullying
- ▶ Unlawful activities

# Dignity for All Students Act

- ▶ This New York State Law prohibits discrimination and harassment against any student by employees or students referring to race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender, and sex.
- ▶ Cyberbullying is defined as harassment or bullying by any form electronic communication, and include incidents occurring off school property that create or may create a risk of substantial disruption within the School environment.
