A Message from the Superintendent



It's hard to believe Spring is almost here! Time seems to be going by quickly. I hope this article finds you and your family happy healthy and enjoying the mild winter. I would like to provide a couple of updates regarding our District.

Facilities Use Study

As stated in the September issue, our District is participating in a transparent and collaborative study of our facilities. As we engage in this study, we continue to make certain that we adhere to the following guiding principles:

- 1. Ensure we are providing optimal learning conditions for our students that is also financially responsible to our taxpayers.
- Ensure that we continue to honor our rich history and traditions while simultaneously maintaining our focus on continuous improvement.

An advisory committee representing broad-based representation from all geographic sections of our school district community have volunteered to serve. The committee is working closely with consultants, Mr. Alan Pole and Dr. Bill Silky of Castallo & Silky LLC who our district has hired to conduct this important study. All meetings are open to the public. While there will be an official advisory committee, all meetings are public and anyone may attend. The meetings will be held in the district's schools and will rotate every meeting. The meeting dates are located on our District calendar and on our website. All meetings will run from 6:30-8:30 p.m. (for several meetings an optional tour of the host district school will also be conducted from 5:45-6:30).

As you may know, we strive to ensure that our District website contains the most accurate, reliable and up to date information regarding our District. As such, all of the Facility Use Study information, including meeting agendas, presentations, and minutes can be found at http://www.mexicocsd.org/domain/296

As you will see from this information on our website, the committee is studying all aspects of our facilities and brainstorming all sorts of ideas. They will weigh pros and cons of each potential idea and make final recommendations along with supporting data and rationale to our BOE in July for their consideration. Please know that these are not decisions, they are data-based collaborative recommendations to improve the way we use our facilities for our students, our taxpayers, and our community, while simultaneously ensuring that we continue to honor our rich history and traditions. From these recommendations, our Board of Education members can decide to use all, some, or none of the recommendations.

As you may know, whenever you complete renovations at home or in any of our buildings, there always seem to be challenges that cause delays. While we have had significant delays during the renovation of our high school auditorium, we are in the last phase, including hanging the stage equipment and look forward to it being completed within the next couple of months. To celebrate the completion of our high school auditorium, we are planning a grand re-opening ceremony. We will notify every one of the date and time and look forward to seeing you there!

You may have noticed that most of the work on the front of our high school is almost completed. Please take a look at the clock; it has been renovated and is now working. Once the weather permits, final painting of our entrance and completion of the front steps and handicap ramp will finalize this portion of our capital project.

The targeted renovation areas of our middle school, including classrooms, hallways, and the elevator have been updated. Not only do they look fantastic, they provide a clean, safe and academic environment that supports increased professionalism and learning. Please feel free to stop by central office for a tour.

Our high school stadium is on track to be started and completed this year. As I have previously stated, we need to begin this construction as soon as possible so that we can complete it before the winter begins again. Renovating our stadium means that it will impact spring sports, graduation and fall sports. While I realize this causes disappointment, our stadium facilities are failing and must be renovated, and there is no other way they can be renovated without the impact.

I thank our Board of Education members who have gone to great lengths to create a plan that best meets the needs of students and our community, which is also fiscally responsible. Once it is completed, I am sure that you will be very pleased!

January Proud to be MACS Honoree

P-TECH connects the school districts within



Oswego County with CiTi (Center for Instruction, Technology & Innovation), OCC (Onondaga Community College), and five local industry



partners, offering students the prospect of simultaneously working toward earning an associate's degree in Applied Science from OCC while earning their Regents High School Diploma - at no cost to the student or their families.

Presently, 56 Oswego County students are enrolled in the P-TECH Program; six are freshmen from Mexico High School.

What is the definition of a Trebuchet? According to medieval-life-and-times.info, "The Trebuchet was a weapon used during siege warfare. The Medieval Trebuchet was similar to a catapult, or stave sling, which was used for hurling heavy stones to smash castle or city walls. The word 'Medieval Trebuchet' is derived from the Old French word 'Trebucher' meaning to throw over."

The process for the class is explained by Andrew MacDonald who says, "We built a Trebuchet from scratch using a swing bucket weight. We will collect more data on trial throws, then we will use the weight of a softball and volleyball to learn the maximum height, distance, miles-per-hour and other facts."

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Day at Syracuse University for Mexico High Music Theory Students

On January 19, 2017, eight Mexico High School students involved in the Music Theory I and AP Music Theory classes were able to take part in a learning extension experience at Syracuse University's Belfer Audio Archive. As part of their coursework, students have been studying introductory musical acoustics, sound production, historical and current recording technology, and basic techniques in sound engineering.

Shaun Kinney (Mexico Academy Class of 2012), a Fifth year graduate student in the Audio Arts Program at Syracuse, gave students a tour of the state of the art, live end-dead end studio within the Belfer facility. Students discussed the engineering and architectural challenges of creating a space suitable of producing a high-fidelity recording while maintaining musical integrity. Shaun then took the students into the control room where they discussed the difference between stereophonic and surround sound recording procedures. To wrap up the day, students also visited Crouse College. This building houses the majority of the programs for Syracuse University's Setnor School of Music. MACS Junior AJ Yost stated, "It was great to see how a professional music studio works. It showed us how cool and intricate the industry really is."
